The last race tested everyone's boat handling skills, and in the end, the senior fleet sailed 5 races and the junior fleet completed 3 races. Two Madison sailors, Quinn Senke and Will Hanson, enjoyed their first regatta race wins in the senior fleet. Quinn won the senior fleet regatta and Will finished 3rd overall in the senior fleet. Great job! Colin Senke, Will Segersten, Micah Hanson, and Fritz Simon raced in the junior fleet with Fritz and Will finishing in the top ten

juniors overall.

Three Madison sailors (Will Segersten, Meta, Fritz) also competed in the ILYA Opti Championship on Lake Pewaukee this week. Meta finished third place in the White Fleet (kids under 10 years old) and 24th overall in the 64 boat fleet. Fritz and Will finished 8th and 12th out of a huge 53 boat Green Fleet.

## **Burrows Park Shoreline Repair Public Meeting Announcement**

In 2011, Barbie Stimpson, MYC Boat Storage Administrator, worked with the City of Madison to request a project to shore up part of the Burrows Park shoreline. This

shoreline has been losing ground for several years due to high waters and wave action. A few years ago, MYC, through the Madison Parks Foundation and the Friends of Burrows Park funded a project to rebuild a small portion of the shoreline. The good news is that the city approved the project for fall of 2012, and has called a public meeting to present the project and answer questions.

Here is the information from City Engineering Department:

The City of Madison is planning a shoreline repair project at Burrows Park. Burrows Park is located at the intersection of Burrows Road and Sherman Avenue. The area currently planned for repair is the eroded area south of the existing piers. The area near the existing piers and boat storage area was previously repaired a few years ago, and no work is planned in this area. At the meeting, city staff will discuss preliminary plans for the project, answer questions, and look for comments from neighbors.

After being contacted by Bruce Wampold, skipper of *Village Idiot II*, Ocie began sailing with Bruce and crew regularly. Ocie says, "Although I have been invited on several boats in Milwaukee and Chicago, I have found a fantastic family with 'the Idiots,' and I enjoy Mendota (miss the Med) greatly." Here, Ocie shares a portion of the email that landed him on the *Idiot II*:

several boats (Yatlant 24, Ronautica 33, Benneteau 33.7, Dufour 34, Bavaria Match 35, Grand Soleil 37, Benneteau 40.7, Benneteau 42s7, IMX 40), all with spinnaker/gennaker. I have my Spanish skipper's license for up to 12 meters sail and motor, and have been a licensed sports sailor also since 2001. During a full year I was hired as the manager of the Euromarina Sailing team on board the Grand Soleil 37; we did the entire Spanish Med circuit concluding in the 25th Kings Cup in Palma de Mallorca. I transported the boat from race to race, performed maintenance, supervised logistics and race inscriptions, and did all of the underwater cleaning of the boat. (FEDAS open water scuba license). Thank you MYC for your help; you have truly made the difference!

**Dale Wettlaufer** is a Vice President and analyst with Madison Investment Advisors. Having grown up on Lake Erie, he has always enjoyed the water, and though he just moved to Madison, he's already enjoying Mendota and Monona aboard his Sea-Ray 240.
