Reconstituted By-Laws

-Barbie Stimpson Notice is hereby given that the attached, reconstituted by-laws dated August 3, 2010, will be discussed and voted upon at the Mendota Yacht Club Annual Business Meeting on September 22, 2010 at the Essen Haus, 514 East Wilson Street, Madison, Wisconsin. The meeting will be convened by Commodore Trey Sprinkman at 7:00 PM, Central Daylight Time.

On August 3 the MYC Board of Directors completed revisions and recommended approval of the attached reconstituted by-laws dated August 3, 2010, to the members attending the Mendota Yacht Club Annual Business Meeting on September 22, 2010. These by-laws have been reconstituted from a version dating back to 1990. The purposes of reconstituting the by-laws are (i) to assure proper reference to our Articles of Incorporation, (ii) to carry

forward all pertinent language from earlier versions of the by-laws, (iii) to update specific information to reflect current practices (e.g., update of committee functions and update of communication practices), (iv) to reorganize the presentation of information for clarity, and (v) to assure proper provisions for the amendment process.

The Board did significant research, diligently reviewed all past records, and carefully reviewed current operating practices to provide these reconstituted by-laws. We heartily invite all members to review the attachment before the annual business meeting, send any comments or questions to the secretary at stimpson@wisc.edu at least 24 hours prior to the meeting, and to attend the annual business meeting at which time these reconstituted by-laws will be discussed, revised as needed, and voted upon for approval by the full membership.

To conserve the club's funds, the review will be conducted using projection of the content. Paper copy will not be provided at the meeting, so please bring your own copy if you wish to have one as a reference. The approved by-laws will be posted on the Mendota Yacht Club website and a paper copy will be placed in the Wisconsin Historical Society archives along with all other archived materials of the club.

4:00 p.m. Coast Guard Auxiliary members will conduct courtesy vessel safety inspections at Christy's pier on Lake Waubesa.

5:00 p.m. Social hour. Minnow races for kids (and adults). Enjoy dinner on your own on Christy's deck overlooking Lake Waubesa. Cash bar.

7:00 p.m. From 1875 to 1896 brave men from stations in Kenosha, Racine, Milwaukee, Sheboygan, Two Rivers, Kewaunee, Sturgeon Bay, Baileys Harbor and Plum Island put out to rescue of vessels in distress along Wisconsin's east coast. Dan Larson, the producer of Lakeshore Guardians will show sections of his program and tell us about some of the rescues that tested the men's endurance and courage.

Following Dan's presentation. Madison Navy League will recognize our first "Coastie of the Year"--an outstanding member of the Coast Guard crew from Station Two Rivers. Wisconsin and the Cutter Wyaconda home ported in Dubuque, lowa. Then we'll officially celebrate the birthday of our nation's oldest seagoing service, the U.S. Coast Guard with a birthday cake.
