## The sailboat classes included are:

**A scow** – 38 foot, 6 to 7 crew. The fastest monohull sailboats on the planet and most difficult to sail. Teamwork is the key to winning. These boats are truly a joy to watch, A scows were created over 100 years ago. Photos and more info: http://www.ascow.org/

**E scow** – 28 foot, 3 to 4 crew, fast and competitive. The E scow is possibly the most popular high performance class in the world. Photos and more info: <a href="http://e-scow.org/">http://e-scow.org/</a>

**C scow** – 20 foot with a single sail. Crewed by 2 to 3 people, the C scow class contains a unique breed of highly competitive racers. Photos and more info: <a href="http://www.cscow.org/">http://www.cscow.org/</a>

**120 scow –** 20 foot with a crew of 2, the I20 fleet contains seasoned veterans as well as beginners. A big family environment yet still very competitive racing. Photos and more info: <a href="http://www.inland20.org/">http://www.inland20.org/</a>

**MC scow** – 16 foot 1 crew, the most popular scow class with competitors ranging from 16 to 80 years old. Like the A, E, and C fleets, the MC fleet draws many top sailors. Photos and more info: <a href="http://mcscow.org/">http://mcscow.org/</a>

**Club 420** – 14 foot crewed by 2 people. The 420 is usually sailed by young men and women in high school and collegiate sailing programs. Highly competitive, these 2 sail rigs are quick and very nimble boats.

C scows: 80 - 95 boats - 285 people - 4 race committee / safety boats 120 scows: 20 - 28 boats - 50 people - 3 race committee / safety boats

E scows: 60 - 70 boats - 275 people - 5 race committee / safety boats & 10 competitor support boats

MC scows: 70 - 80 boats - 80 people - 4 race committee / safety boats Club 420s: 15 - 20 boats - 30 people - 3 race committee / safety boats

#### Venues:

Regatta Headquarters: Governor Nelson State Park

Launching: All classes except Club 420s will launch at Governor Nelson State Park.

Club 420's will launch at Burrows Park.

We expect that the launch ramp at Governor Nelson will be the busiest at these times

on regatta days when competitors launch and recover boats:

8:00 – 9:00 a.m. 3:00 – 4:00 p.m.

Racing Area: Three courses will be set each weekend, approximately ¾ mile from shore. Exact

location will vary depending on wind direction.

Spectators: Sailboat races can be exciting spectator events and we encourage boaters to come
